FINANCE & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Deputy Mayor Randell reported that they met on May 25, 2021 to discuss HR issues.

WORKS & PLANNING

Councillor Brake reported that they met on May 24, 2021. Items of discussion were: new animal regulations, educational pamphlet on ATV use to be sent out to the public, light up crosswalks are up and working, speeding issues on Main Street and Earle Drive and recapping of streets is done.

RECREATION & COMMUNITY SERVICES

Councillor Walsh reported that they met on May 20, 2021. Items discussed were boat launch, June is recreation month, baseball/softball programs are ready to go ahead, 47 children are enrolled for September program, 32 children are registered for the summer program, AM transmitter purchased, pre-kindergarden program started this week, Jump Start program started a new girls basketball program. The Recreation Director has advised that a new sensory playground is being set up behind Pasadena Place. Councillor Walsh also welcomed Gregory Whelan to the Recreation Department as the Program Coordinator.

Councillor Anthony also commented on the \$12,000 grant received for the girl's basketball program and all the programs that are underway. He also informed that the department has not yet been able to fill the lifeguard positions for this summer. He also hopes to put the new FM transmitter to use soon.

Mayor Bishop and Councillor Dillman entered council chambers at 8:13 p.m.

Councillor Anthony asked about the railway station and was informed by Deputy Mayor Randell that the committee is in "fact finding mode" and will be ready soon to present to Council. Councillor Anthony also reported that the Oasis Restaurant will open on June 15th and that the beach has been cleaned and is in good condition. He would like to see all roads approved for ATV use and the cadets have a great program available to individuals here in Pasadena.

Councillor Dillman expressed her thanks to the cadets and had attended their virtual ACR this evening.
