COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Deputy Mayor Randell passed the gavel to Councillor Decker.

Deputy Mayor Randell advised that the committee met on April 11, 2022 and the following items were discussed: reviewed the terms of reference for committee structures; policy on hate symbols; HR issues; financial update; fire works and creation of communication policy.

WORKS & PLANNING

Councillor Cormier reported that the committee met on April 12, 2022. Items discussed were: placement of speed bumps; capital works; splash pad; blue gulch dam; storm sewer on Forest Road and Tamarack Avenue; fire works regulations; clean up period and review of ATV regulations.

RECREATION & COMMUNITY SERVICES

Councillor Walsh reported that the committee met on April 8, 2022. Items discussed were: grants; facility maintenance; dog park; Heritage Committee scanning party; life guards for Pasadena Beach; Volunteer Appreciation Week; downtown development & trails masterplan video will soon be available; possible child minding service for fitness center users; all operations at Pasadena Place are back to pre-covid-19 standards ; ATV regulations and walking trails.

CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

Mr. Hudson reported that the water treatment upgrades is on schedule. He also advised that our one unit water treatment UV Light system is at its end of life and has to be replaced with a two unit UV Light system. Just received word that prime consultant agreement for splash pad is ready for signing. He also informed Council that a second aerial fly over of the Town will be happening soon.
