COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Deputy Mayor Randell advised that the committee met on March 28, 2022. The following items were discussed: reviewed commercial listing of properties in town; discussed Bill CC29; looking at making some of our policies the same as Deer Lake and Steady Brook for the benefit of our Municipal Enforcement Officer and next week will be reviewing quarterly budget. Deputy Mayor Randell presented the following resolutions:

WORKS & PLANNING

Councillor Cormier advised that the committee met on March 28, 2022. He discussed the following items: reviewing ATV regulations; possibility of flying the Ukraine flag; clean up of dog park by community volunteers; poor condition of Main Street; update from Town Superintendent; water dig ups have started again this year and reviewing 4 way stop at Church and First Avenue.

Councillor Cormier presented the following resolutions:

RECREATION & COMMUNITY SERVICES

Councillor Walsh advised that the committee met on March 28, 2022. All operations at Pasadena Place are now fully operational.

The following grants have been received: grant for needs assessment for childcare capacity; grant from MMSB to host a community wide cleanup; cultural funding grant regarding Come Home Year and Pasadena Days; awarded Queen's Platinum Jubilee for a celebration of the Queens 70th year of reign and a garden party/intergeneration day is being planned for July 27th from the grant.

Hoping to host the closing ceremonies for Come Home Year 2022/Pasadena Days at Pasadena Beach and the Director of Recreation is actively trying to recruit life guards for Pasadena Beach this summer.

The Director of Recreation will also be meeting with the Town Superintendent in the near future to go over a plan for regular maintenance of outdoor facilities.

Downtown & Trails and Master Plan is posted online and has received a lot of response to date.

The Heritage Committee in conjunction with the 100th anniversary of South Brook will be holding a scanning day on April 19th and they are asking residents to review old pictures to bring along to be scanned.

Deputy Mayor Randell advised that the the Public Library AGM will be held on April 6th. He also attended Strawberry Festival Meeting, MNL Youth Caucus Meeting, and did Mental Health webinar. The Great Humber Joint Council was supposed to be held this weekend,

however quorum was not met. He has also received concerns from residents about safety for walkers on transmission bridge and residents throwing snow onto roadways.

Councillor Brake wished good luck to both the junior high school boys and junior high school girls volleyball teams on their upcoming tournaments this weekend.

Councillor Decker advised he attended a webinar held by the Federation of Canadian Municipalities on diversity, equity and inclusion and it was very informative. He reminded all Council that this coming Thursday is Budget Day and its importance for many groups of people. He also advised that he is considering registering for the MNL being held in Gander from May 5 - 7, 2022.

Councillor Hall advised that he attended Strawberry Festival Meeting on April 2th.

All Council congratulated the Pasadena AAA Falcons boys basketball team on winning gold this past weekend.

Councillor Walsh announced that we have received a grant in the amount of \$100,000.00 for a community bus. Unfortunately, there is a global shortage of bus chassis so we may have to wait awhile to actually receive the bus. She thanked everyone involved in obtaining this grant for the residents and organizations of Pasadena.
