COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Deputy Mayor Randell advised that the committee did not meet. He presented the following resolution.

WORKS & PLANNING

Councillor Cormier advised that the committee met on June 15, 2022. Items discussed were infrastructure and capital projects. He presented the following resolutions.

93-22 Cormier / Hall be it resolved that the Town of Pasadena approve invoice # 4447 from Western Pump Services in the amount of \$16,656.45 (HST inclusive) for emergency repairs to a sewer lift station.

Ormier / Hall be it resolved that Council requests staff to apply for a grant opportunity from the Federation of Canadian Municipalities' Municipal Asset Management Program for an Asset Management Program.

Be it therefore resolved that the Town of Pasadena commits to conducting the following activities in its proposed project submitted to the Federation of Canadian Municipalities' Municipal Asset Management Program to advance our asset management program:

- 1. Update asset register of major assets including water, sewer, roads, storm and fleet in spreadsheet and GIS.
- Develop operations and maintenance plan for critical assets and provide training to staff on managing data and continuously improving O&M plans and continuously updating AM and Capital Program
- 3. Prepare a Preliminary Capital Program and Public-facing Asset Fact Sheets.

Be it further resolved that the Town commits \$5,500.00 from its budget toward the costs of this initiative.

Councillor Walsh advised that the committee met on June 13, 2022. Items discussed were: rentals at Pasadena Place are down and possibility reducing rates during the summer months; summer camps are almost full; a tiller for volleyball courts was purchased and works great; swings for Tenth Avenue have arrived and will be installed later this month; received another grant for two more high school students in the amount of \$5,000.00; planning for come home year is under way and entertainment is being booked and a list of trails that need repairs will be done during the summer months if summer students have time.
