ADMINISTRATION, CORPORATE SERVICES & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

INFRASTRUCTURE, ENGINEERING, PLANNING

Councillor Decker advised that there has not been a committee meeting since the last regular council meeting, however, he gave the following updates:

- Pasadena Health Center - framing of interior walls has been completed.
- Library – set up and decorating underway. Open for online book reservation and pick up only.
- Tree House – tenant is completing their fix up work and decorating. Programming has started.
- Splash Pad – low bidder has been determined. Working on an award. 2023 start depending on weather
- Water Treatment Plant Upgrades – installation of equipment complete. Pre-commissioning complete. Final commissioning to begin Oct 16.
- Skating Rink & Swimming Pool – 66% drawings submitted for skating rink.
- Forest & Tamarack Storm Sewer – awaiting award to Marine Contractors. 2023 start depending on weather
- Lakeshore Sanitary Sewer, Tipping Phase II/Maxwell Waterline, Tipping/Maxwell Paving – request for consulting services has been advertised.
- Blue Gulch Dam Replacement – dam break analysis has been received. Proceeding with engineering of new structure.
- SAM Celebration scheduled for October 14th (11:00 – 1:30). It's a family oriented event open to everyone.
- Smoke Alarm Installation – project has begun.
- 14 residential Building permits issued.
- Municipal Food Waste Program – foodcyclers available for purchase.
- Paint Recycling Program – document in review/approval process.
- CCTV Sewer Inspections – work continuing on Sanitary Sewer. Storm Sewer to began shortly after.
